Bronte ISD allows senior level students the opportunity to enroll at Howard College for the purpose of earning high school, as well as college credit, by taking selected dual credit classes. Students must meet the acceptance requirements set by Howard College.

The Pre-AP and advanced placement courses seek to provide the most academically talented students with opportunities for creative/critical thinking and problem solving. Additionally, the advanced level measures that represent the requirements of the Distinguished Achievement Program and Texas Scholars Program provide students numerous opportunities to perform a professional or college level in significant areas.

Advanced placement courses offered during the junior and senior year provide college level curriculum that prepares students to take the College Board Advanced Placement examinations. A successful score on the advanced placement examination gives students college placement and/or credit for the course taken in high school.

Currently, Bronte ISD only offers Pre-AP and AP courses in English I-II and English III-IV. The goal of the Pre-AP and advanced placement programs is to challenge and stimulate the students to the highest level of their abilities.
